Obviously my phone didn't stop ringing after yesterdays site visit to Carron so I decided to sleep on it and look at the issue as dispassionately as possible in the morning. As you know, Paul Masson is extremely distressed by this, as are the committee of CVDG.

Firstly, my understanding of the need for Chris Ross to visit Carron was to grade and Risk Assess the trails, and we obviously have no problems with this. As the employer on this contract CVDG will also be subjecting the work to independent assessment when construction on all 4 trail sections has been completed, snagged and practical completion issued.

I dont intend to address the issue of opinions on how those present thought the trails would ride. That is purely subjective, none of them brought a bike and it is the public that decide whether a trail is good or bad. Similarly, emotive comments such as 'I wouldn't open it' are revealing but hardly productive. It seems we're damned if we dont defend ourselves and we're damned if we do, so we might as well get this out in the open: The fact that many of those connected with the 7S would rather Carron was strangled at birth is virtually a matter of record. I will be quite happy to outline why I believe this is so - off air. Aside from the continued support of yourself Andy and Michael we are thoroughly sick of this ' doing it in spite of them' mentality we've had to adopt. For the record I happen to think they are being incredibly short sighted and that they are ultimately biting the hand that will feed them - but that's another story.

It is highly regrettable it has come to this however, it seems these prejudices decided the outcome of yesterdays visit before the gate was even opened. I desperately want to avoid this descending into personalities and politics but that is the long and short of it and I feel the line has been well and truly crossed.

As you know, Jamie Wright is a Civil Engineer, he is both Planning Supervisor & Resident Engineer on this project. Paul Masson runs a business and has a first class commercial reputation to uphold. Nobody is beyond criticism and Paul is on record as saying he will examine any constructive comments carefully. Doing a complete hatchet job on a project in a manner which calls peoples professional integrity into question is quite another matter and we will not allow this to go unchallenged. CVDG are a volunteer group who's achievements should warrant just a little bit more respect from some of your colleagues and we take the strongest objection to the distorted manner in which the message was delivered.
