Carron Valley Forest represents a **huge recreational resource** – right on the doorstep of central Scotland

- 2.8 million people live within an hour's drive of the forest
- The combination of water, forests and hills provide a fantastic setting for all kinds of recreational activities

The Carron Valley Trails project started as a vision shared by a handful of committed enthusiasts who saw the **vast untapped potential** in a little known forest

These enthusiasts went on to form the **award winning** Carron Valley Development Group in 2003

In 2006, Carron Valley Development Group entered the Carron Valley Partnership to **build on the success** of the initial mountain bike trails and develop the forest into a valuable recreational resource for the people of central Scotland and beyond.

Over the past couple of years Carron Valley Development Group have built 10km of some of the **best singletrack** in **Scotland**

It's not been easy — it's taken nearly 15,000 hours of effort by volunteers to get to this point

In addition, CVDG volunteers have raised all of the £125,000 it cost to build the phase one trails

Rider numbers stack up against many of the established Scottish trail centres — we estimate that in the first year we attracted 14,000 mountain bikers to Carron Valley

Research carried out for Forestry Commission Scotland forecasts that a mountain bike centre at Carron Valley could attract nearly **50,000 riders a year**





Phase 1 of the Carron Valley Trails project has **proven** the need for further development at Carron Valley

- In our first year we estimate that **14,000** mountain bikers visited the trails and 2007 numbers show a 10% increase
- Research shows that a major expansion of the trail network could attract nearly 50,000
- Clanranald's exciting development of DunCarron will attract visitors from near and far
- In addition, the forest and the reservoir could provide recreation for thousands of walkers, horse riders and watersport enthusiasts

Further development of Carron Valley will bring real, lasting benefits to local communities

- A recent study of Laggan Wolftrax showed that the additional 15,000 visitors attracted to the area by the mountain bike trails generated £280,000 for the local community and the equivalent of seven full time jobs
- Carron Valley is ideally situated for developing improved opportunities to promote access and healthy living within easy reach of a huge population
