Carron Valley successfully hosts first Specialized Challenge Series and Giant Dirt Demo event of 2008

Organised by the legendary Patrick Adams of Mountain Mayhem fame, the day was hailed as a huge success with over 100 riders turning up to try out bikes during the day and almost 50 more out testing the kit and the trails in the dark.

"The trails at Carron Valley are really excellent – they have a great flow to them and being a downhiller I like the fact that you don't have to climb for ages to earn the descents! You also get a real feeling of remoteness up here too – the scenery is spectacular"
